Executive Summary

Personnel Changes/Issues/Updates

- Officers Jarvis and Canales and TCO Hampton has been placed on COVID leave due to exposures and/or positive tests.
- All 2020 Firearm qualifications were completed for the year by personnel.

Major/Significant Events

- On 11/1/20 at 1045 pm officers responded to a home in reference to a domestic violence situation. During the dispute a male resident had threatened his wife with a knife. The DA's office accepted charges on the male who was booked into the Harris County Jail.
- On 11/13/20 at 4 am in the morning officers located a suspicious male on a bicycle riding in a neighborhood. Upon checking the male, he was found to be concealing his identity and to be in possession of several bottles of unopened high-end whiskey and a stolen loaded 9mm handgun. The subject was out on bond for committing other felony crimes (burglaries). The subject was booked into the Harris county jail.
- On 11/22/20 at 8:45 pm officers responded to an armed robbery on Hunters Way Court. A visitor to the villages was robbed at gun point upon arriving in the Villages. Approximately 2 hours later the victims stolen vehicle was stopped in SE Houston where 4 subjects were taken into custody. The driver was placed under arrest and a forearm was also recovered. The adult was booked into the Harris County Jail. Charges are pending on the 3 juvenile passengers.
- On 11/29/20 at 7:45 pm officers investigated the suicide of a 15-year-old male juvenile in Bunker Hill. This was the 4th suicide of 2020. Detectives investigated the scene and determined that no foul play had been involved.

Status Update on any Major Projects


- The new 2020 marked units were delivered and have bene placed into service. All units have been assigned to evening shift.



Follow-up on Previous Month Items/Requests from Commission

• The 2021 RFP for employee Health Care Insurance providers has been initiated. This year will also include supplemental Insurance, Vision and Dental Insurance.

Personnel Changes/Issues/Updates

- Two officers were placed on COVID leave as the result of an exposure to a confirmed positive family member. One employee has returned to duty.
- Annual Evaluations were completed for all employees.
- All employees finished up completing the 2020 physical assessments. Due to COVID protocols they were self-assessments. As a result of the testing, one employee is being set-up with a physical conditioning plan to assist him with improving his anaerobic condition.
- 2020 Annual Physical Examinations were completed, and documentation received by the HR manager.
- One of our CID detectives has decided to rotate patrol in January. An opening for a detective has been posted and a selection process has been initiated. 8 officers have showed interest in the CID position.
- Dispatch personnel held their annual work bid and have made seniority-based shift changes.
- Eligible Personnel have been scheduled to receive approved annual salary adjustments effective 1/2/21.

Major/Significant Events

- On December 17, 2020 officers escorted the Annual Twinkle Light Parade through Bunker Hill. The department also had 2 floats in the parade. Attendance was high and there were no issues with traffic.
- 12/30/20 at 14:00 Hours. Officers dealt with a resident who had been threatening suicide and making threats to harm others. Officers attempted to negotiate with the subject who refused to communicate with them. The subject attempted to flee from his home and was taken into custody by officers. The subject was found to be in possession of an assault rifle, handgun and 160 rounds of ammunition.

Status Update on any Major Projects

- MVPD participated in pre-construction meetings with BH and BHE Staff for the construction and traffic management plan for the new school. A signage plan was put together, and an operational plan prepared for first the 90 days of the project.
- The ALPR project completed 2020 with 61 stolen vehicle recoveries, 5 Missing persons recoveries and 1 fugitive apprehension. The value of the recovered stolen vehicles was estimated at \$1.1 million dollars.





2020 Auto Burglary Map





Executive Summary

The Drainage Committee continues to evaluate the City's Drainage Master Plan and Priority Projects identified taking into account the results/impact of various rain events, development ordinances and redevelopment plans to make recommendations to the City Council for priority projects. In August, the City adopted the Harris County's minimum standards to be consistent across all of Harris County. This requirement including updating rain data to the NOAA Atlas 14 Rain Data. Basically, this standard makes the "Previous 500 Year Event" the "New 100 Year Event."

Over the past months, the Drainage Committee recommended and the City Council approved the City's Drainage Engineer RPS to update the City's drainage model and see the impact on the City with the new data. The Drainage Committee has been reviewing the results of the model.

In addition, Staff has been working with Bunker Hill Elementary School to discuss partnership opportunities to include detention with the school reconstruction project. Preliminary Engineering found that there may be up to 2 Acre Feet of Detention available under the proposed ball field on the site. The preliminary cost estimate was within the City's benchmark of \$1.0M per Acre-Foot. As a result, staff requested that RPS review and run the City's model to see the impact of the detention.

The results of the model exercise were presented to the Drainage Committee. The Committee found significant results in the model with the added detention. In addition, the priority of addressing street flooding exceeding 18 inches was significantly reduced in the area. As a result, the Committee recommended the Bunker Hill Elementary Detention to be the highest priority project at this time noting this opportune timing. Once construction of the school is complete, the City may not have another opportunity to obtain detention in this area.







Bunker Hill Elem Detention - Results of Model



Executive Summary

As previously discussed, the City has been working with the City's Financial Advisor, Masterson Advisors, to identify the best means to fund Water Well No. 5 and possible detention at Bunker Hill Elementary School. This has been discussed with the Finance Committee and the Council over the past months. As discussed, Masterson has recommended the issuance of Certificates of Obligation. Interest rates are at a record low and the Certificate of Obligation process is still available and an excellent means for Cities to access funding for infrastructure projects.

Representatives with Masterson will be at the Council Meeting via Zoom to present the steps that are needed and to outline the Plan of Finance. In addition, there are two Resolutions that are needed for the process as we work through the schedules for the projects and the timeframe needed for funding.

As noted in the Plan of Finance, the total debt issue is an amount not to exceed \$7.5 Million. It is estimated that \$5.5 Million will be needed for the well and \$2.0 Million for Detention; however, the actual amounts to cover each project can be balanced as the projects unfold. The plan also shows a 20 year payoff for the well supported by a transfer to the Debt Service Fund from the Utility Fund and a 10 year payoff for the detention project. The 10-year payoff coincides with the debt schedule remaining in the Debt Service Fund support by Tax Revenues and provides a plan to meet Senate Bill 2 and the long range plan for the City's General Fund and implementing the Infrastructure Management Plan.

Bond Counsel is provided by Hunton Andrews Kurth LLP.

The Finance Committee has reviewed the plan and recommends the City proceed with the issue.





NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas (the "City"), will meet at the City Hall Council Chambers, at 11977 Memorial Drive, Houston, Texas, 77024 at 5:30 p.m. on the 23rd day of March, 2021, which is the time and place tentatively set for the passage of an ordinance and such other action as may be deemed necessary to authorize the issuance of the City's certificates of obligation, in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$7,500,000 payable from ad valorem taxation and from a limited pledge of a subordinate lien on the net revenues of the City's water and sewer system, bearing interest at any rate or rates not to exceed the maximum interest rate now or hereafter authorized by law, as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance, and maturing over a period of years not to exceed thirty (30) years from the date thereof, for the purpose of evidencing the indebtedness of the City to pay all or any part of the contractual obligations to be incurred for (i) the construction, improvement, repair, rehabilitation and equipment of the City's water and sewer system, including a new water well and transmission lines (ii) the construction of drainage and storm water detention improvements, (iii) the cost of professional services in connection therewith, and (iv) the costs of issuance of the Certificates.

It is estimated that the combined principal and interest required to pay the certificates is \$8,583,750. Such estimate is provided for illustrative purposes only, and is based on an assumed interest rate of 1.80%. As of the date of this notice, the aggregate principal amount outstanding of tax-supported debt obligations of the City is \$6,395,000, and based on the City's expectations, as of the date of this notice the combined principal and interest required to pay all of the outstanding tax-supported debt obligations of the City on time and in full is \$7,507,969. Such amounts are derived from projections obtained from the City's financial advisor based upon current market conditions and is provided from the City without assurance that such projections will be realized. The City cannot guarantee that such conditions will continue through the date of the sale of the Certificates.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS, EXPRESSING INTENT TO REIMBURSE EXPENDITURES WITH PROCEEDS OF A BORROWING

WHEREAS, the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas (the "City"), is a municipality of the State of Texas authorized to finance its activities by issuing obligations pursuant to the Texas Government Code and Texas Local Government Code, which may include obligations that qualify for an income tax credit or tax-exempt obligations pursuant to Section 103 of the Internal Revenue of 1986, as amended (the "Code") (collectively, "tax-advantaged obligations"); and

WHEREAS, the City intends to acquire, construct, equip and furnish various capital improvements listed on Exhibit A attached hereto (collectively, the "Project") for the benefit of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City expects to commence work on the Project and to advance its own funds to pay costs related to the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City reasonably expects to issue tax-advantaged obligations subsequent to the date hereof to finance the costs associated with the Project;

WHEREAS, the City desires to preserve its ability under federal tax law to reimburse itself for expenditures associated with the Project from the proceeds of such tax-advantaged obligations;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that:

- <u>Section 1.</u> The City hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself for expenditures paid within the last 60 days and that will be paid subsequent to the date hereof in connection with the Project from the proceeds of tax-advantaged obligations.
- <u>Section 2.</u> The City reasonably expects that the maximum principal amount of tax-advantaged obligations issued by the City to finance costs associated with the Project will not exceed \$7,500,000.
- <u>Section 3.</u> Each expenditure to be reimbursed pursuant to this Resolution was or will be, unless otherwise approved by bond counsel, either (a) of a type properly chargeable to capital account under general federal income tax principles (determined as of the date of the expenditure) or (b) a cost of issuance with respect to the tax-advantaged obligations issued for the Project.
- Section 4. Any reimbursement allocation pursuant to this Resolution will be made no later than 18 months after the later of the date on which the expenditure is paid or the applicable portion of the Project is placed in service or abandoned, but in no event more than three years after

the date on which the expenditure is paid, subject to exceptions available under Treas. Reg. § 1.150-2(f), including for certain "preliminary expenditures" and certain *de minimis* amounts.

Section 5. This Resolution will be kept in the books and records maintained by the City with respect to the tax-advantaged obligations.

WHEREAS, Greg Abbott, Governor of the State of Texas, entered a declaration of disaster on March 13, 2020 as a result of the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, Harris County Judge, Lina Hidalgo, entered a stay home, work safe order for all of Harris County on March 24, 2020 to last until April 3, 2020, due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus; and

WHEREAS, on March 31, 2020, Judge Hidalgo extended the stay home, work safe order until April 30, 2020 and has continued orders to date; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas issued a disaster declaration on March 24, 2020 and approved on April 21, 2020, May 19, 2020, June 16, 2020, August 18, 2020, September 15, 2020, October 20, 2020 and November 17, 2020 an extension to the order; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas will continue to follow the Governor's direction for the extension of this emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas finds it to be in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of its citizens to extend this declaration of disaster for an additional thirty (30) days; and

WHEREAS, by this Declaration, the City Council declares all rules and regulations that may inhibit or prevent prompt response to this threat suspended for the duration of the incident; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority granted to the Mayor under the Texas Disaster Act, the Mayor, with the consent of Council authorizes the use of all available resources of state government and political subdivisions to assist in the City's response to this situation; now, therefore.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The facts and matters contained in the preamble to this ordinance are hereby found to be true and correct.

- <u>Section 2</u>. Extension of Local State of Disaster. That the local state of disaster and public health emergency previously declared for the City of Bunker Hill Village pursuant to §418.108 of the Texas Disaster Act is hereby extended for 30 days from the date of this ordinance or unless terminated or modified by earlier ordinance of the City.
- <u>Section 3.</u> Publicity and Filing. Pursuant to §418.108(c) of the Texas Disaster Act, this declaration of a local state of disaster due to this public health emergency shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary.
- <u>Section 4.</u> Activation of the City Emergency Management Plan. Pursuant to §418.108(d) of the Texas Disaster Act, this declaration of a local state of disaster due to this public health emergency activates the City of Bunker Hill Village Emergency Management Plan.
- Section 5. Temporary Housing and Emergency Shelter. Pursuant to §418.020(d) of the Texas Disaster Act, this declaration authorizes the City to: (1) temporarily or permanently acquire by lease, purchase, or other means sites required for temporary housing units or emergency shelters for disaster victims; and (2) enter into arrangements necessary to prepare or equip the sites for installation and use of temporary housing units or emergency shelters, including arrangements necessary for the transportation and purchase of temporary housing units or emergency shelters.
- Section 6. In the event any clause phrase, provision, sentence, or part of this Ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstances shall for any reason be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect, impair, or invalidate this Ordinance as a whole or any part or provision hereof other than the part declared to be invalid or unconstitutional; and the City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas, declares that it would have passed each and every part of the same notwithstanding the omission of any such part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, whether there be one or more parts.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.

Executive Summary

There are several action items on this month's City Administrator's Report that we wanted to bring to City Council's attention and provide support documentation. All other items/reports are routine.

- A. Consideration and Possible Action Consenting to the Payment of Reimbursable COVID 19 Expenses to the following as submitted on behalf of the Public Safety Departments by the City of Bunker Hill to the Cares Act, Small Cities Assistance Program, Administered by Harris County:
 - Village Fire Department \$15,020.81
 - Memorial Villages Police Department \$52,876.98

The City's Finance Manager worked with Memorial Villages Police Department and the Village Fire Department in applying for reimbursement of COVID 19 Expenses to the Cares Act, Small Cities Assistance Program, Administered by Harris County on their behalf. As Council will recall, the county allocated specified dollars to the Cities in Harris County and Bunker Hill identified dollars available and offered this to our Public Safety Departments. The Finance Manager also worked with Hunters Creek to assist with these reimbursements through their available funds.

The City was very pleased to receive approval for these department's expenses in the amount of \$67,897.79. Harris County has submitted payment to Bunker Hill. This approval allows the City to reimburse these Departments in the amounts as shown above.

F. Consideration and Possible Action to Hire Oziel Reyna, Jr. as a Permanent Employee with the City of Bunker Hill Village's Public Works Department in accordance with the City's Personnel Policy

In November the City Council amended the City's Personnel Policy regarding Nepotism. The policy did not allow for family members of existing personnel to work for the City. The amendment approved to the policy allows the opportunity to continue the practice by approval of the City Administrator for part time, seasonal or temporary help as needed. However, for any full-time employment, it is recommended that appointment be approved by the City

Council. In addition, the policy stipulates that a relative is not supervising or managing another relative.

In accordance with the policy, Staff is recommending the hiring of Oziel Reyna, Jr., son of Oziel Reyna as a permanent employee allowing him to have full benefits. Oziel Jr., has been working as seasonal, hourly help with the City as needed during this year during his school breaks. His performance has been outstanding. He has recently been working as a result of a vacancy on the Public Works Team.

The City has historically had a difficult time locating and hiring personnel for positions on our field crew. Oziel Jr. has been very willing to work, he is prompt and ready to work each day and is a very bright and energetic addition to the team. His desire is to work for the City and continue attending college in the evenings. We have configured his employment so that his direct supervisor is Gama Escamilla and this arrangement has worked well.

Staff recommends that Council approve the City Administrator to have the opportunity to hire Oziel Reyna, Jr. as a full time employee of the City of Bunker Hill Village following the process for full time employment.

Executive Summary

This summary is combined for presentation as Staff and Langford Engineering review the City Hall Site and evaluate additional needs that are recommended while the current construction is underway and the budget is evaluated with firm costs. Items below were anticipated and funded in the Utility Fund CIP:

X. Contract with Viking

In November 2020, the City Council approved a contract with Viking Industrial Painting for recoating the City Hall Water Storage Tank for implementation in early 2021. Construction funding was approved with the 2021 Budget in the amount of \$250,000 including contingency. The contract was awarded at highest cost to cover the potential needs of a new roof.

After the initial blasting and removal of the interior coating of the tank, the roof of the tank will require replacement. The amount authorized in the November 2020 meeting through the various alternatives was \$236,000 which will be sufficient to include the cost of replacement of the roof panels. With some funding available, Staff and Langford Engineering made a request to Viking Industrial Painting to provide costs for additional painting/maintenance improvements for the site. The proposed work includes:

- Painting of piping and the control panel for Water Well No. 4 in front of City Hall
- Painting of the generator housing and reinsulate piping after the painting is completed

The costs are provided in Change Order No. 1 at a cost of \$17,750.00. Approval of this additional work would result in a total contract amount of \$253,750.00 which is \$3,750.00 above the budgeted amount. The overage could be funded out of the Utility Fund CIP for Booster Pumps as noted below.

XI. Contract with Neil Technical Services (NTS) -

The City's Engineer has also been working with Staff on the continuation of conversion from a hydro-pneumatic tank to variable speed booster pumps for this plant. Please recall that the current contract with Viking Industrial Painting includes the removal of the current hydro-pneumatic tank which was leaking and no longer being used. With the removal of the tank and the plant being removed from service for January and February of 2021, this would be the best time to move forward with full conversion to the variable speed drive equipment which will involve the City's on-call electrical contractor, NTS.

Staff and Langford have been working with NTS to determine the total cost for the installation of the Variable Frequency Drive units and additional equipment to incorporate the units with the computer control. The total cost is \$56,700.00.

Funding for this work is available in the Utility Fund CIP Well and Booster Pumps which includes an approved budget of \$100,000.

In addition, there is electrical and mechanical maintenance expenses needed for water production facilities at City Hall totaling \$19,100.00. Funding for this maintenance work is also available out of the Utility Fund CIP Well and Booster Pumps Budget.

As noted, there is available funding to also cover the overage in the Ground Storage Tank.

The attached spreadsheet shows the detail of all of the discussed expenses.

These improvements can be made over the next few months as the storage tank is down and will be ready for service for the 2021 peak season.

The City has been working with Spring Branch ISD regarding the reconstruction of Bunker Hill Elementary School and water service to the site. It was determined that a new water line along Taylorcrest Crest Court was needed to replace the existing line both to provide the school services and to replace an aging line. City Council awarded a construction contract with Underground Construction Solutions, L.C. at the November 15, 2020 City Council Meeting and the work was completed in December 2020.

A final inspection and reconciliation of quantities was performed and there are several items which quantities are less than the contract amounts. Executive Summary

The City of Bunker Hill Village holds its election for the Mayor and City Council on the May General Election Date for each year. The election for Positions 1, 2, and 3 are held in even numbered years, while the election for Mayor and Positions 4 and 5 are held in odd numbered years. The next scheduled City Election is Saturday, May 1, 2021 and accordingly, will be for the Mayor and Positions 4 and 5. Filing for a position on the ballet will begin January 13, 2021 and will conclude February 12, 2021.

The attached Ordinance outlines the election information.

Election Judges will also be named. Officers to be named include Clara Towsley as the Presiding Judge and Tom Rigamonti as the Alternate Presiding Judge. Both were named last year; however, no election was held. Both have agreed to serve again this year if needed.

Staff recommends approval of this Ordinance calling the City's Annual Election.

ORDINANCE NO. 21 - 541

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF A GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON SATURDAY, MAY 1, 2021, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING THE MAYOR AND TWO COUNCILMEMBERS (POSITION NOS. 4 AND 5); PROVIDING DETAILS RELATING TO THE HOLDING OF SUCH ELECTION; AND CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE SUBJECT.

* * * * * *

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. In accordance with the general laws and Constitution of the State of Texas, a General Municipal Election is hereby called and ordered for the 1st Saturday in May 2021, the same being the 1st day of said month, at which general election all qualified voters of the City may vote for the purpose of electing the following officials of the City:

Mayor

Councilmember, Position 4

Councilmember, Position 5

Section 2. No persons name shall be placed upon the official ballot as a candidate for any of the above-mentioned positions unless such person has filed his or her sworn application, as provided by Section 141.031 of the TEXAS ELECTION CODE, with the City Secretary of the City at the City Offices, located at 11977 Memorial Drive, Houston, Texas 77024, not later than five o'clock (5:00) p.m. on the seventy eighth (78th) day before the date of such election (February 12, 2021). The City Secretary shall note on the face of each such application the date and time of its filing. Such application shall include the office the candidate is seeking and, if applicable, the position number of such position.

Section 3. The present boundaries of the City constituting one election precinct, the polls shall be open for voting from seven o'clock (7:00) a.m. until seven o'clock (7:00) p.m. at the following polling place, and the following are hereby appointed officers to conduct the above-described election at said polling place:

The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to provide a copy of this Ordinance to each judge as written notice of the appointment as required by Section 32.009 of the TEXAS ELECTION CODE.

The Presiding Judge shall have the authority to appoint no more than ten (10) clerks to assist in the holding of said election, but in no event shall the Presiding Judge appoint less than two (2) clerks.

The City Secretary is hereby appointed clerk for early voting; the Section 4. appointment of a deputy clerk or clerks for early voting by the City Secretary shall be in accordance with Section 83.031 et seq. of the TEXAS ELECTION CODE. The City Office of the City of Bunker Hill Village, 11977 Memorial Drive, Houston, Texas 77024, is hereby designated as the place for early voting for said election. Except as otherwise provided below, said clerks shall keep said office open during the hours that the City Secretary's main office is regularly open for business, that is from seven (7:00) a.m. until four-thirty (4:30) p.m., Monday - Thursday, and Friday from seven (7:00) a.m. until noon (12:00) p.m., for early voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official state or federal holiday, beginning on the twelfth (12th) day Monday April 19, 2021; and continuing through the fourth (4th) day Tuesday April 27, 2021, preceding the date of said election. Said clerks shall not permit anyone to vote early by personal appearance on any day which is not a regular working day for the clerk's office, and under no circumstances shall they permit anyone to vote early by personal appearance at any time when such office is not open to the public. As required by Section 85.005(d), TEXAS ELECTION CODE, early voting by personal appearance at the main early voting polling place shall be conducted for at least twelve (12) hours on two weekdays; therefore early voting by personal appearance shall be conducted from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, April 21, 2021 and Tuesday, April 27, 2021. The above-described place for early voting is also the clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent. The early voting clerk, in accordance with the provisions of the TEXAS ELECTION CODE, shall maintain a roster listing each person who votes early by personal appearance and each person to whom a ballot to be voted by mail is sent. The roster shall be maintained in a form approved by the Secretary of State.

Section 5. The Election Judge is hereby appointed as Presiding Judge of the Early Ballot Board. In accordance with Section 87.001, *et seq.*, TEXAS ELECTION CODE, said Presiding Judge shall appoint at least two (2) other members to said Board, and shall process early voting results in accordance with said TEXAS ELECTION CODE.

Section 6. Electronic Voting Systems and paper balloting shall be used for said election, both in the early voting and for voting on election day, in accordance with the Texas Election Code. All expenditures necessary for the conduct of the election and the purchase of materials therefore are hereby authorized. Compensation of all election officials is hereby established at the maximum amounts permitted under Section 32.091 *et seq.*, TEXAS ELECTION CODE.

<u>Section 7.</u> The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to furnish all necessary election supplies to conduct such election.

Section 8. The candidates receiving the highest number of votes in each of the positions to be filled at such election shall be declared elected to such positions.

Section 9. The order in which the names of the candidates are to be printed on the ballot for the general and special election shall be determined by a drawing by the City Secretary, as provided by Section 52.094 of the TEXAS ELECTION CODE. The City Secretary shall post a notice in her office of the date, hour and place of drawing. Such notice shall remain posted continuously for seventy-two (72) hours immediately proceeding the scheduled time of the drawing, and personal notice shall also be given to any candidate who makes written request for such notice and furnishes to the City Secretary a self-addressed, stamped envelope. Each candidate involved in the drawing, or his/her designated representative, shall have a right to be present and observe the drawing.

Section 10. Notice of said election shall be given in accordance with the provisions of

the TEXAS ELECTION CODE and returns of such notice shall be made as provided for in said Code. The Mayor shall issue all necessary orders and writs for such election, and returns of such election shall be made to the City Secretary immediately after the closing of the polls.

Section 11. Said election shall be held in accordance with the TEXAS ELECTION CODE and the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended.

On the consent agenda you will find a contract with the Houston Community Newspaper. This contract provides for set costs for the year. These costs remain the same 2021.

ORDINANCE NO. 21 - 542

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS, BY DELETING ALL OF SECTION 2-4, OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER, OF ARTICLE I, IN GENERAL, OF CHAPTER 2, ADMINISTRATION, AND ADDING A NEW SECTION 2-4, OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER, OF ARTICLE I, IN GENERAL, OF CHAPTER 2, ADMINISTRATION, SAID SECTION DESIGNATING THE MEMORIAL EXAMINER (HOUSTON COMMUNITY NEWSPAPER) AS THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF THE CITY; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT

* * * * * * * * *

WHEREAS, Section 52.004 of the Texas Local Government Code requires that the City Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas designate an Official Newspaper for the publication of legal notices; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds it to be in the best interest of the citizens to designate the Memorial Examiner, a Houston Community Newspaper, as the City's Official Newspaper; now, therefore:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUNKER HILL VILLAGE, TEXAS:

Section 1. The facts and matters set forth in the preamble are hereby found to be true and correct.

Section 2. The Code of Ordinances of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas, is hereby amended by deleting all of Section 2-4, Official Newspaper, of Article I, In General, of Chapter 2, Administration, a new Section 2-4 to read as follows:

The Memorial Examiner (Houston Community Newspaper (HCN)) a newspaper in general circulation in the City of Bunker Hill Village, and a newspaper qualified, able, and willing to publish legal notices and advertisements, is hereby and hereon selected and designated as the "Official Newspaper of the City of Bunker Hill Village."

The right to terminate this designation is hereby and hereon reserved by the Council of the City of Bunker Hill Village, Texas, and said city council has the right to terminate one (1) newspaper and designate another at any time. Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict herewith, are, to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict, hereby repealed.
