CRIME ANALYSIS SUMMARY

BUNKER HILL

On October 4th an officer stopped a vehicle in the 200 block of Gessner Road for a traffic violation. During the stop the driver was asked to exit his vehicle and the driver then fled the scene on foot. The officer further found marijuana in the vehicle. The officer will seek a warrant for the offenses of evading detention and possession of marijuana.

On October 5th an officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation in the 200 block of Gessner Road. The driver was found to be driving with an invalid driver's license. The driver was placed under arrest for driving while license invalid.

On October 10th officers responded to the 200 block of Gessner Road in reference to a single vehicle accident. The vehicle struck a road sign. During the accident investigation the driver was found to be intoxicated. The driver was placed under arrest for driving while intoxicated.

PINEY POINT

On October 8th an officer responded to the 11300 block of Smithdale Road in reference to an identity theft. An unknown person opened an account online. This case is currently under investigation.

HUNTERS CREEK

On October 5th officers responded to the 300 block of Lindenwood Drive in reference to solicitors. During the contact with the solicitors, one was found to be in possession of marijuana. He was placed under arrest for possession of marijuana.

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

The most important tools that anyone has in keeping themselves from becoming a victim of crime is self-awareness and preparedness. The following recommendations can help protect you from a number of different types of crimes.

ANYTIME that you are going to be out after dark, regardless of the reason, remember that there is safety in numbers. Also try to avoid being in dimly lit areas since this is a real asset to criminals.

IF you must be out alone it is also recommended that you carry a cellular telephone with you so that if you should encounter a problem you can quickly call for assistance.

NEVER leave any valuables visible in any parked vehicle, regardless of where it is parked. Valuables should be locked in the trunk or some other storage area or concealed from sight from outside of the vehicle. **ALWAYS** be sure to lock your vehicle when it is unattended even for a short period of time and set the alarm system if your vehicle is equipped with one.

ALWAYS keep all of the doors of your home locked day or night and if you have an alarm system, be sure to set it anytime you are away from home even for a short period of time.
