## CRIME ANALYSIS SUMMARY

### BUNKER HILL

On February 24<sup>th</sup> officers responded to a residence on Our Lane Cove in reference to a burglary of a habitation. Jewelry was stolen from the residence. Forced entry was made by breaking out a large window at the back of the residence. This case is currently under investigation.

On February 27<sup>th</sup> officers responded to the 600 block of Bunker Hill Road in reference to suspicious subjects. Upon contacting the subjects it was found that one subject was wanted from the City of Houston PD on traffic warrants and the other subject was in possession of marijuana. Both subjects were placed under arrest.

### PINEY POINT

On February 22<sup>nd</sup>, we received a phone call from West University Place Police Department in reference to possible burglary of a vehicle. It was determined that the burglary of vehicle occurred in the 200 block of Kinkaid School Road. The subject was filed on by the West University Place Police Department.

On February 26<sup>th</sup> officers responded to the 200 block of Kensington Lane in reference to an alarm. When officers arrived they observed a broken window by the front door. Entry is not believed to be made into the residence. This case is currently under investigation.

On February 27<sup>th</sup> officers responded to the 500 block of Lanecrest Lane in reference to an attempted burglary of a residence. The resident was home when the suspects attempted to break out a window by the front door. When the suspects saw the resident, they left the scene. This case is currently under investigation.

On February 27<sup>th</sup> an officer responded to the 11200 block of Wilding Lane in reference to theft of copper that occurred within the last 9 months.

### **HUNTERS CREEK**

On February 21<sup>st</sup> an officer responded to the 8400 block of Katy Freeway in reference to a burglary of a motor vehicle. Nothing appeared to have been taken from inside the vehicle. A suspect has possibly been identified and we are awaiting lab analysis on possible DNA from the scene and DNA from the possible suspect.

On February 21<sup>st</sup> officers responded to the 10700 block of Memorial Drive in reference to a disturbance. Officers determined that two subjects were intoxicated and a danger to themselves and others. Both subjects were placed under arrest for public intoxication.

On February 23<sup>rd</sup> an officer observed a suspicious person in the 8500 block of Katy Freeway. The officer contacted the subject and the subject was found to be intoxicated and a danger to himself and others. The subject was placed under arrest for public intoxication.

On February 26<sup>th</sup> an officer responded to the 700 block of Kuhlman Road in reference to a hit and run accident. There were no injuries in the accident. The suspect vehicle was described as a black Mazda, no other information.

On February 26, 2014, we received a call for an active alarm at 200 Block of Kensington Lane. Officers arrived and noticed a front window busted out. Entry to the residence is not believed to have occurred.

On February 27<sup>th</sup> an attempted burglary of a residence occurred in the 500 block of Lanecrest. The resident was home and observed the suspect listed below. Entry was not made into the residence.

There were 2 black males observed driving a small 4 door sedan possibly a Toyota style. The LP possibly contained the digits BXP

Hedwig Village PD also had 2 instances on with the same suspects on February 26, 2014. They had a front door kicked in on a residence, but does not appear to be anything taken from the residence. While officers were on scene of this burglary, Hedwig PD received

another call of a suspicious black male subject knocking on the door asking for a Mr. Fargo driving a charcoal grey 4 door sedan possibly a Nissan. This occurred between 11:00 am - Noon.

If you have anybody approach your residence, that you are not expecting, call the Memorial Villages Police Department, or the law enforcement agency in your jurisdiction. You do not have to open the door or talk to the person. If you observe any person matching the description of this suspect, call 911 immediately. They are suspects in several other daytime burglaries in the Tealwood/Tanglewood area. They are most active between 10 am and 2 pm.

Witnesses have observed the following types of vehicle present when this suspect has burglarized or knocked on the front door:

A blk SUV possibly a Equinox style (this vehicle was observed by the victim but he did not see the suspect)

A charcoal grey 4 door sedan or Impala possibly displaying TXLP BX3B966

A blk 2001 Pontiac (either a Grand Am or Grand Prix) displaying TXLP BCV8206

The only suspect that we have identified at this time is Williams, Demeche Dontae B/M.
