From the Mayor

Dear Residents,

We have had a great week celebrating our City! We were able to thank our numerous volunteers at our annual holiday reception. We were also honored to recognize our Public Servant of the Year, "Mr. Jesse" from Frostwood Elementary School and our Residents of the Year, our Bunker Hill Little League Players on the Post Oak World Series Team: Cade West, Andy Guy, and Charlie Wylie and Coach, David Wylie. We also enjoyed our 2nd Annual Twinkle Light Parade.

I would also like to take this time to thank all of our residents that have attended the City Council Meetings and/or the Village Fire Commission Meetings. Bunker Hill's Settlement Presentation to the Commission included the following points:

- Bunker Hill's desire to stay in the Village Fire Department. At the meeting, Bunker Hill paid all pending invoices which totaled \$21,626.25 and committed to the 2019 expenses.
- When additional staff is needed at the Village Fire Department, a second Station should be added in the southwestern area to house the additional staff. Bunker Hill offered to acquire the property, design, build and finance Station 2.

In summary, Bunker Hill Village desires to remain a full member City of the Village Fire Department and wants to work in good faith with the Fire Commission and Fire Chief to plan for additional staff and Fire Station 2.

The Commission took no action on the settlement presentation; however, did discuss having a sub-committee develop an amendment to the inter-local agreement between all cities to continue Bunker Hill's services after 2019.

Bunker Hill's powerpoint presentation and other studies on this topic are provided on the City's website under "Latest News".

We are very hopeful that these issues can be resolved and we can improve response times in Bunker Hill Village over time. In the mean time, we continue working with the Memorial Villages Police Department to help respond to Fire and EMS calls within the national standard.
