Tree Maintenance Reminder



Property owners are responsible for the care/maintenance of trees in the City's right-of-way adjacent to their property. Overhanging trees should be maintained at a height of at least 13' 6" to ensure adequate clearance for vehicles (fire trucks, garbage trucks, etc.) on the road providing essential City services.

From the Mayor

Dear Residents:

Fiscal responsibility is a priority of this City Council. I am committed to maintaining a strong long-term financial position that provides stability and flexibility for our City while continuing to keep the tax rate as low as possible. Here are a few ways we have placed our commitment into action:

Government Treasurers' Organization of Texas (GTOT) Award – I am proud to announce that in May 2023, the GTOT awarded a certificate of distinction to the City for its comprehensive investment policy. The investment policy details specific policies, guidelines, and strategies for the investment of the City's public funds. The City is one of only 11 entities to receive this distinction in 2023. A special recognition to Susan Grass, Finance Director, whose dedicated efforts made this award possible.

Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) – During the 2022 annual audit process, the City elected to complete an ACFR. The report provides an overview and analysis of the City's revenues and expenditures for the previous fiscal years and demonstrates the City's commitment to stewardship and accountability with public funds over time. The ACFR is considered the highest level of governmental financial reporting. I encourage you to read the report, which tells our City's impressive financial story, on the <u>City's website</u>.

Financial Management Policy Statements – At the June 2023 meeting, Council adopted an updated version of the City's Financial Management Policy. Creating and adhering to a long-term financial plan allows the City to make strategic, forward-looking decisions during the budgeting process. With the guidance of strong principles, we plan for the City's financial future with a degree of certainty we would not otherwise enjoy. A special thank you to the stewardship of the City's Financial Audit Committee in developing this plan.

2024 Budget Process – As the budget process begins, Council has sharpened its collective pencils and put in the effort to battle inflation that has hammered the cost to deliver resident services (especially police, fire, and water). Nevertheless, we are committed to lowering the tax rate while maintaining the quality of life and operations that is the hallmark of our City. Public safety and public infrastructure remain the primary focus as we aim to ensure a resilient and sustainable City for current and future generations.
